

Champion of Champions

Armin Nedjat introduces the Champions implant system and discusses the future of the UK dental implant market

Tell us a little bit about your background - what led you into dentistry?

As my father used to work as a dentist, and was one of the first dentists doing implants in Germany, I was familiar with this profession early in my life. So, for me it wasn't a big decision to choose this profession and to study dentistry.

What is it about dental implants that attracted you?

Before implant dentistry came up, bridges, partial and full prostheses were 'state of the art' to replace missing teeth. I have experienced implant dentistry right from the start, and I am convinced that the discipline comes closest to nature when it comes to replacing missing teeth.

Why did you decide to develop your own system?

After I tried various implant systems, I found that all of them had good approaches, but did not fully satisfy my tendency toward perfection. So, I started to develop a system that came closest to my ideas. Above all, I was convinced by the minimally invasive method of implant dentistry, since it conserves the existing bone and tissue structures, and I optimised my system for this patient-friendly procedure.

What was the hardest part about getting your own implant business underway?

In the beginning, the most difficult thing for me - with what, back then, was a small company - was to start positioning my system against the established companies in the market. In recent years, this has become much easier, since even the 'big ones' have recognised the advantages of minimally invasive implant dentistry and are gradually trying to integrate this into their own

concepts. But not all these can really say they are minimally invasive - as to my mind, the most important part of the minimally invasive method of implant dentistry, is not to re-open the gingiva.

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Tell us more about the Champions system itself - what are its key features and benefits?

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The key part here is the two-piece Revolution implant, with its patented Shuttle on top. The Shuttle is the essential key to minimally invasive surgery, because it has four functions in one: insertion tool, cover screw, healing abutment and gingiva former, and impression tool. It is the main reason that reopening the gingiva is no longer necessary.

What can UK dentists look forward to from you over the coming year?

The philosophy of our company and the Champions implant system is:

- · Premium quality for a budget price
- · Easy handling for the surgeon
- · Can be integrated in the usual dentist's day without special surgery days
- · Pain-free (as far as possible) for the patient. These great benefits, that dentists all around the world already use and like, should be available now for UK dentists too.
